### **Mobile Market Volunteering**

Looking for a fulfilling way to interact with others in your community? Look no further than joining us at a Mobile Market! Mobile Markets are pop-up food pantries located in Berks and Schuylkill county. In 2023, volunteers distributed over 1.7 million pounds of food at Mobile Markets. In 2024, that number has increased to over 2.3 million! Mobiles are held outside approximately 25 times a month at 23 different locations. We can't meet the increasing demand of our community without your help! If you're able, try a Mobile Market! That's where we consistently need the most help!



# UPDATES ON THE HELPING HARVEST COMMUNITY KITCHEN

The Helping Harvest Community Kitchen is moving toward completion and is scheduled to open in the next few months. This facility, located in the Goggleworks II building on Washington Street, will be used to prepare, cook, and package heat-and-eat ready meals for our neighbors facing food insecurity. The Helping Harvest Community Kitchen will allow us to accept bulk donations that were not previously able to be accepted for distribution. Once open, the kitchen is anticipated to produce 2,500 meals per week for seniors in our community that struggle with food insecurity.

Another exciting feature of the new facility is the culinary arts training program, which will allow culinary students to gain hands-on experience with food preparation and packaging, as well as access to a state-of-the-art facility, highly qualified instructors, and top of the line equipment. Curriculum will focus on food safety, proper skill techniques, and working in a kitchen environment with others.

In addition to the kitchen and classroom space, the Community Kitchen will house offices for several staff members, including referral specialists for programs like WIC and SNAP, a nutrition educator, and an outreach coordinator. The relocation of these services to downtown Reading will make them more easily accessible to the members of our community that are facing food insecurity.
