Court Ordered and Community Service Guidelines

Helping Harvest accepts applicants needing to complete court mandated community service hours, but only if the following conditions are met:

- The charge is deemed a mild offense. Felonies will not be accepted. Helping
 Harvest will not accept cases that involve firearm possession, larceny, theft,
 violent crimes, or assault of any kind.
- Applicants must be 16 years of age or older.
- Applicants must log-in and create their own VolunteerHub profile. They must also submit the information needed to complete a background check.
- Background checks for applicants who are requesting placement at off-site locations will be reviewed prior to volunteering.
- It is the responsibility of the applicant to schedule their own shifts and track their own hours within VolunteerHub. This platform tracks hours accurately, so long as the applicant signs in and out.
- If the applicant misses three shifts without contacting the Volunteer Coordinator first, the applicant will be denied the opportunity to complete additional volunteer hours.
- After completing the hours requested, the Volunteer Coordinator will sign any necessary paperwork or will sign documentation on Helping Harvest letterhead.
- Failure to comply with the Helping Harvest policies and regulations will result in immediate termination.

Helping Harvest reserves the right to refuse applicants on a case-by-case basis and will notify the applicant should there be an issue accepting their application.
